Regular MEETING HELD ON THE thirteenth DAY OF July A. D. 1976

The motion to approve the bills as read was made by Foster and supported by Schaner. The motion passed unanimously.

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A motion to pay two auxiliary poles #35 <sup>each</sup> ~~each~~ <sup>was made</sup> ~~was~~ <sup>by</sup> Foster with Scharrer supporting. The motion passed unanimously.

The supervisor explained the park's request for a \$34,000 advance which is required for their receipt of the DNR grant.

A motion to advance the \$34,000 to the park board <sup>upon request</sup> ~~was~~ <sup>requested</sup> was made by Foster supported by Block. The motion passed unanimously.

The supervisor explained the cemetery and township ~~gasline~~ boundary establishment. A motion to give township attorney Jack Kerr the authority to take necessary steps to establish north boundary of cemetery was made by Scharrer and supported by Foster. The motion passed unanimously.

The supervisor read a letter from the county board of commissioners regarding BA 150 of 1976 which affects road construction. The effect upon the township is that we can have no roadwork done in 1977 due to extension of time required before work can begin.

The supervisor read a letter from the planning commission regarding a 703 permit for a parking lot at the 11-83 Market. The permit, according to Mr. Bailes, has been approved and is in Mrs. Tipton's hands.

A motion to approve the letting of water contracts to Grove and Otto Taylor construction companies, the low bidder, for the water project was made by Scharrer supported by Foster. The motion passed

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unanimously.

The ordinance to set the water rates for the town's water supply system was read by Lawrence Country. A motion to approve the ordinance was made by Strong, supported by Foster. The motion passed unanimously. A copy is attached.

A motion to amend the park board budget by \$34,000 for a loan to finish project # 26-007 was made by Scherer, supported by Foster. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion to adjourn was made by Foster, supported by Block. The motion passed unanimously.
