A motion to hire Lane and Appold as the township auditors was made by Foster, supported by Block. The motion passed unanimously.

A motion to amend the township repair and maintenance budget \$3,000 ~~from~~ ^{to} \$1,000 was made by Scharrer, supported by Block. The motion passed unanimously.

A motion to amend the township capital outlay budget from \$500 to \$2500 was made by Scharrer and supported by Foster. The motion passed unanimously.

The treasurer reported that the budget is running on target so far this year.

A motion to reappoint Nan Bailey as deputy clerk was made by Foster and supported by Block. The motion passed unanimously.
